## ODFW Fishing Report

### (As of Jan 8th)

- As a general reminder for Anglers: Maximize distance from bank anglers and other boats. Safely row or motor around anglers and other boats and avoid motoring nearshore and in shallow areas!
- Check the zone in which you intend to fish before you head out. Access can change quickly with winter flooding, snow and ice conditions.
- Fishing is fair to good on the North Coast. The North Fork Nehalem, Necanicum River, and Lower Columbia tributaries (Gnat Cr, Big Cr, and Klaskanine R) all have hatchery steelhead being caught. The Nestucca and Wilson Rivers also have hatchery steelhead returning and those fisheries are off to a good start when conditions are right. More rain early this week may make for challenging conditions mid-week, but most basins should be in good shape for the weekend.
- Wild coho retention is open on both Siltcoos and Takenitch lakes. The bite has been fair so far. Fish can access both lakes via the fish ladders and have been coming in over the past few weeks!
- Lost Creek Reservoir has had great reports by folks trolling for rainbow trout.
- Steelhead fishing is good on the Umatilla River.
- Steelhead fishing has been good on the Grande Ronde, Imnaha and Umatilla Rivers

- The Upper Williamson River above Kirk Road Bridge is now open year round. Access is currently available.
- There are some nice holdover trout in the Malheur River below Warm Springs right now.
- Trout fishing has been great at Chickahominy Reservoir
- Crab quality is good as shells have hardened and are full of meat.

### Northwest zone

- Winter steelhead fishing is fair to good on the North Coast. The North Fork Nehalem, Necanicum River, and Lower Columbia tributaries (Gnat Cr, Big Cr, and Klaskanine R) all have hatchery steelhead being caught. The Nestucca and Wilson Rivers also have hatchery steelhead returning and those fisheries are off to a good start when conditions are right. More rain early this week may make for challenging conditions mid-week, but most basins should be in good shape for the weekend.
- Coffenbury Lake and Vernonia Pond have both been stocked with surplus hatchery winter steelhead to provide additional angler opportunity. Catching a steelhead in still water can be a fun and unique experience and offer a chance for steelhead when the rivers are blown out.
- Winter Steelhead is off to a strong start on our midcoast systems. After the rains we got the past few weeks, lots of fish have pushed in and up into our systems. The Alsea and Siletz have had a decent amount of fish being caught, and the Siuslaw is doing well!
- Siletz River HWY 229 is closed at approximately milepost 14 due to a large land slide covering the road. It will be closed for an undetermined amount of time.

### Willamette zone

- The Willamette River and other water bodies are increasing in activity.

- Several waterbodies will be stocked with trout this week.

Cascade Hike-in Lakes offer beauty, serenity, and the potential for untrammelled fishing opportunities.

### Central Zone

- Expect high flows and increased turbidity on the lower Deschutes this week, which will impact fishing conditions

- The Crooked and Metolius Rivers continue to provide excellent winter angling opportunities.
- Anglers report excellent dry fly and nymphing opportunities on Fall River.
- Anglers report good bank fishing opportunities for trout at Haystack Reservoir, now with surplus brood fish being stocked.
- Anglers report excellent kokanee fishing at Lake Billy Chinook.

## Fishing Notices:

**COLUMBIA RIVER:** Bonneville and Dalles pools closed for Sturgeon. John Day pool closed 9 Jan.

- **Season:** Open Thursday, Jan. 1 – Friday, Jan. 9, seven days per week.
- **Area:** Mainstem Columbia River from John Day Dam to McNary Dam, and all adjacent tributaries.
- **Daily bag limit:** One fish.
- **Legal size:** 43-inch minimum and 54-inch maximum fork length (fork length is measured in a straight line from the tip of the nose to the fork in the caudal fin (tail) with the fish laying on its side on a flat surface, with the tape measure/ruler positioned flat under the fish).

## **ALSEA RIVER:** Hatchery winter steelhead

Hatchery Steelhead is open on the Alsea River. The early bite has picked up and fish are reaching our Hatchery traps at the Alsea Hatchery! The Alsea River does have a hatchery component to its winter steelhead run offering additional opportunities for harvest! The traps at Alsea River Hatchery are open and currently seeing their first wave of winter steelhead hit the hatchery. However, the Alsea River fishing hotline is no longer in operation. For up to date upper/lower trap counts click [here](#). For more information on steelhead fishing on the Alsea, reach out to Alsea Hatchery Staff or Midcoast District staff.

The hatchery holes provide decent bank access though space is limited, Lower floats have also been productive in the Alsea basin particularly around the Salmonberry launch!

## **NESTUCCA BASIN (Nestucca, Three Rivers, and Little Nestucca):** Winter steelhead

Winter steelhead fishing is fair on the Nestucca when conditions are good and should continue to improve. Heavy rains today may bring the river up and off color, but it should be fishable by the weekend. The Nestucca gets one of our largest hatchery winter steelhead releases and is a top pick for those wanting to catch fish they can keep. *Last updated 1/6/26.*

## **SILETZ RIVER:** Winter Steelhead

Winter steelhead are moving into the Siletz! The town loop float and beyond have been productive through the holiday weeks, and moving into this weekend, the majority of the midcoast should be quite fishable! The Siletz Gorge offers additional bank opportunity but is only open for driving during the weekends.

There was a landslide on HWY 229 resulting in a road closure at approximately milepost 14.5.

HWY229 will be closed for the foreseeable future until crews are able to safely remove the debris from the roadway.

*As a general reminder for Anglers:* Help to protect boating opportunities by maximizing distance from bank anglers and other boats. Safely row or motor around anglers and other boats and avoid motoring nearshore and in shallow areas!

## **WILSON RIVER:** steelhead

The Wilson has winter steelhead showing up and some being caught, and fishing should continue to improve over the next couple months. Heavy rains may have the Wilson a little off color



by this afternoon, but it should drop back into shape quickly and be in good shape by the latter part of the week. The Wilson has one of our largest hatchery steelhead releases and is a top pick for those wanting to catch a keeper. *Last updated 1/6/26.* Wilson River levels and predictions are available [here](#).

**DETROIT RESERVOIR:** trout

Refilling the reservoir for the summer will begin on Feb. 1. Water levels are currently too low to safely launch boats at Mongold State Park. The crowds are mostly gone this time of year, especially during the week, so anglers can find fish as well as solitude. Pretty much any technique will catch fish, but it might take some experimenting to find out what is most effective on the day you're out there.

The reservoir gets stocked with trout during the late spring and summer. As a reminder, anglers are allowed to keep up to five trout, with an additional five kokanee.

It's always a good idea to check the water levels at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website before using the boat ramps. For the latest information on water levels at Detroit Reservoir check with the Army Corps of Engineers' [website for more information](#). *Last updated 01/05/26.*

Also, as a reminder to anglers, fishing for and harvesting Chinook in the lake and the rivers above is prohibited. Any Chinook caught in Detroit must be released unharmed. Make sure you can tell the difference between a Chinook and a kokanee before you get out on the water. Anglers are encouraged to report their catch on an [on-line form](#). Remember to indicate whether the fish you catch have their adipose fin or not. This information will allow ODFW to manage the fishery for the benefit of both recreational anglers and the resource.

**SANTIAM RIVER (NORTH FORK):** Salmon, steelhead

River levels best for fishing are at or below 3,000 cfs, and the river is currently running at around 5,300 cfs at the gage in Mahama. Flows will likely be higher by the weekend. There are still a few holdover summer steelhead, however. Spin cast with lures or swing large streamer flies through the pools.

There are several large, downed trees in the river creating some dangerous hazards for boaters in the lower river. For more information check out the [Oregon State Marine Board website](#).

Fishing for hatchery steelhead is open year-round, but the use of bait is not allowed between Nov. 1 and April 21. *Last updated 01/05/26.*

**SANTIAM RIVER (SOUTH FORK):** steelhead, bass, trout,

Fishing is generally best when flows are below 3,000 cfs. Flows are currently at around 5,600 cfs at the gage in Waterloo, but these conditions are unlikely to persist with rain forecasted for later this week. Fishing for summer steelhead is open year-round although there are few adults left in the basin. At this time of year, the majority of these are in the upper sections above Waterloo, from below the deadline at Wiley Creek to Pleasant Valley boat ramp. *Last updated 01/05/26.*

**WALLING POND:** trout, panfish

This eight-acre privately-owned pond has been **closed** since 11/8/23. No stocking scheduled due to potential changes in public access.

**WALTER WIRTH LAKE:** trout, bass, panfish.

This urban lake usually gets stocked from about Thanksgiving through May. The rest of the year anglers can target bluegill and bass. It was stocked recently with 2,200 trout. Some of the extra-large brood trout released before Christmas may still be present as well.

As a reminder, only one fish out a 5-fish bag limit may be longer than 20 inches. Walter Wirth is a 20-acre lake located within the City of Salem's Cascades Gateway Park with good access all the way around. *Last updated 12/20/25.*

**WILLAMETTE RIVER:** sturgeon, steelhead, spring Chinook, coho, small and largemouth bass

Smallmouth bass can be a lot of fun to catch and are plentiful between Salem and Corvallis during the spring and summer. Trout prefer the cooler temperatures upstream of Corvallis. From Salem downstream there are plenty of largemouth bass in the deeper, quieter sections. *Last updated 11/25/25.*

**OCEAN:** The Ocean Endorsement cost is in addition to a fishing license and Combined Angling Tag, if required.

- Anglers can purchase an annual Ocean Endorsement that is valid through the calendar year or a daily endorsement that is valid for a single day.
- The cost is the same for residents and non-residents:
  - Annual Endorsement: \$9
  - Daily Endorsement: \$4

HALIBUT- CLOSED. Season options for 2026 will be proposed in mid-February.

SALMON- CLOSED. Season options for 2026 will be proposed in March.

BOTTOMFISH- Limit of 4 bottomfish a day and 3 lingcod over 22 inches

**Depoe Bay:** Rockfish catches were near limits with mostly black, deacon, and canary rockfishes. Lingcod catches were good with around 1.5 fish on average.

**Newport:** The average catch was just over 2 rockfish per angler. A good mix of black, canary, and copper rockfishes and greenling were landed. Lingcod catch averaged just over 1 fish per angler.

**Charleston:** Anglers saw an average of 2 rockfish, with a good mix landed. Lingcod landings were about 1.5 fish per angler.

**Brookings:** Anglers caught around 2 rockfish each. Mostly black, blue, deacon, and canary rockfishes. Lingcod catch was around 0.5 fish per angler.

DUNGENESS CRAB- OPEN- Crabbing in **Newport** and **Waldport** has been fair. Crab quality is good as shells have hardened and are full of meat.

RAZOR CLAMS

- OPEN from WA border to Cape Blanco.
- CLOSED Cape Blanco to the CA border.

MUSSELS

- OPEN from WA border to CA border.

## Bay Clams are OPEN

EUROPEAN GREEN CRAB- OPEN- This invasive species now has a limit of 35 per day to encourage harvest. While they look like Oregon's native shore crabs, they have three prominent bumps between the eyes and 5 spines down the side of the carapace.

CHINESE MITTEN CRAB- Invasive and now found in the Columbia and the Willamette. It is important to [correctly identify](#) this species and report it to the Oregon Invasive Species hotline [online](#) or by calling 1-866-INVADER or to [your local ODFW office](#) with the location found. ODFW encourages the public to keep an eye out for mitten crab.

**[Seal and Sea Lion Reporter:](#)** The Seal and Sea Lion Reporter is an ESRI Survey123 form that can be used by anyone to report pinniped sightings to the Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife's (ODFW) Marine Mammal Program. Sightings can be reported using either a web browser or a mobile app, real-time or after-the-fact, and in the field or back at one's home or office. This crowd-sourced data will be used to identify potential pinniped "hot spots" in the basin for future research or management.

Note that no personal information is asked for or collected by the form and there are no usernames or passwords needed. The form is quite easy to use, and hopefully self-explanatory, but detailed instructions are given below for reference.
