

ODFW Fishing Report

(As of Mar 5th)



Oregon anglers are blessed with year-round fishing opportunities.

- North coast steelhead fishing was moderate to slow last weekend despite excellent conditions in most places. This week flows are dropping to lower levels on the small streams while the bigger basins should fish well. There are winter steelhead throughout the fisheries. The Nestucca, Wilson and North Fork Nehalem Rivers will offer the best opportunities for catching hatchery steelhead.
- Surplus winter steelhead have been released into Coffenbury Lake, Vernonia Pond and Lost Lake, and surplus summer steelhead were released into Town Lake last week. These fish can be a great alternative when conditions in the rivers are less than ideal, and fighting a steelhead in still water is a unique and fun experience.
- After our big rains last week, the Mid Coast shaped back up into fishable water. Steelhead are moving throughout our basins as the temperatures rise!
- With spring on the way, trout in Detroit Reservoir, and other waterbodies, are getting more active in searching for food.
- Trout stocking in the Willamette Valley has begun in earnest.
- Kokanee fishing has been excellent on Lake Billy Chinook with fish averaging 13 inches.
- Excess brood rainbow trout from Wizard Falls Hatchery have been released at Pine Nursery Pond in Bend and Haystack Reservoir, this is a unique opportunity to catch trophy-size fish.

- Columbia- Spring Chinook. Effective March 1 – April 6: the following area, retention, and daily bag limit regulations apply:
 - Area definition: Buoy 10 line upstream to Beacon Rock plus only the Oregon and Washington banks from Beacon Rock upstream to the Bonneville Dam deadline.
 - Legal upstream boat boundary defined as: A deadline marker on the Oregon bank (approximately four miles downstream from Bonneville Dam Powerhouse One) in a straight line through the western tip of Pierce Island to a deadline marker on the Washington bank at Beacon Rock.
 - Retention allowed: open for hatchery Chinook and hatchery steelhead. Shad may also be retained.
 - Daily bag limit: two adult hatchery salmonids (Chinook or steelhead) per day, but only one may be a Chinook.
 - All other permanent regulations apply.

COLUMBIA RIVER: Closed for Sturgeon.

ALSEA RIVER: Steelhead

Hatchery steelhead is in full swing on the Alsea! After a shaky start due to weather, fish moved into the basin and have been migrating about. This past week the bite has slowed down, but fish are still moving throughout the basin. After the rains we got last week, we saw lots of fish push in, and the river will be fishable going into the weekend!

There's a lot of bank fishing access, and fish have been getting caught, near the hatchery holes! Drift fishing in the lower basin has also been productive for anglers in the Alsea Basin. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

NESTUCCA BASIN (Nestucca, Three Rivers, and Little Nestucca): winter steelhead

The Nestucca is in good shape as of this writing and should remain so through the weekend. There are both hatchery and wild winter steelhead (catch-and-release only for wilds) throughout the fishery with fresh fish still coming in. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

SILETZ RIVER: winter steelhead

Winter steelhead slowed down a bit on the Siletz. Like its neighbors, it's been a fair season on the Siletz, with fish seemingly being caught in big waves this year. Fish are taking advantage of the warmer weather and moving higher up into the basin. Fish have been caught in the upper gorge area and throughout some of the lower drift floats.

The upper gorge offers bank access for targeting winter steelhead, though with the icy winter conditions it could be a tough drive – but worth the effort. The gorge road has cleared out quite a bit since our snow and ice storms over the past few months, making the area accessible once again. Just a reminder that the gorge road is closed to public driving access during the weekdays M-F but opens for the weekend for the public to access!

The Siletz is a truly unique system offering multiple opportunities for a variety of species. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

WILSON RIVER: winter steelhead

The Wilson dropped into prime shape last weekend and fishing effort was high, surprisingly the fishing was a little slow with a few fish being caught. It does appear to have picked up the last couple days judging from broodstock collections. It'll be getting a little low and clear over the weekend. These conditions will be a good time to fish smaller beads, throw hardware or pull plugs. There are both hatchery and wild steelhead (catch-and-release only for wilds) throughout the fishery. *Last updated 3/5/25.* Wilson River levels and predictions are available [here](#).

DETROIT RESERVOIR: trout

The reservoir is slowly filling up in preparation for the busy summer recreation season. Mongold boat ramp is currently open and available to launch watercraft. Now that spring is around the corner fish are starting to get hungrier and become more active in searching for food. Pretty much any technique will catch fish, but it might take some experimenting to find out what is most effective on the day you're out there. The reservoir gets stocked with trout during the spring and summer with many of these fish still available throughout the fall and winter and into next year. As a reminder,

anglers are allowed to keep up to five trout, with an additional five fish kokanee bag limit. Also, as a reminder to anglers, fishing for and harvesting Chinook in the lake and the rivers above is prohibited. Any Chinook caught in Detroit must be released unharmed. Make sure you can tell the difference between a Chinook and a kokanee before you get out on the water.

It's always a good idea to check the water levels at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website before using the boat ramps. For the latest information on water levels at Detroit Reservoir check with the Army Corps of Engineers' [website for more information](#). Anglers are encouraged to report their catch on an [on-line form](#). Remember to indicate whether the fish you catch have their adipose fin or not. This information will allow ODFW to manage the fishery for the benefit of both recreational anglers and the resource. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

SANTIAM RIVER (NORTH FORK): Salmon, steelhead

River levels best for fishing are at or below 3,000 cfs, and the river is currently running at about 3,600 cfs at the gage in Mehama.

Fishing for steelhead is open year-round, but the use of bait is not allowed between Nov. 1 and April 21. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

There are several large, downed trees in the river creating some dangerous hazards for boaters in the lower river. For more information check out the Oregon State Marine Board website.

SANTIAM RIVER (SOUTH FORK): steelhead, bass, trout,

Fishing is generally best when flows are below 3,000 cfs. Flows are at 3,100 cfs at the gage in Waterloo.

There are still some scattered summer steelhead in the river, but everything else is catch-and-release. Spring chinook and the next run of summer steelhead will begin to arrive in April. Anglers should be aware that bait is not allowed from Nov 1 to April 21. *Last updated 3/5/25.*

WALLING POND: trout, panfish

This eight-acre privately-owned pond has been **closed** since 11/8/23. Stocking scheduled to begin in November 2024, but not currently listed.

WALTER WIRTH LAKE: trout, bass, panfish.

This urban lake usually gets stocked from about Thanksgiving through May. The rest of the year anglers can target bluegill and bass. It will be stocked this week with about 1,500 trout. Only one fish out a 5-fish bag limit may be longer than 20 inches.

Walter Wirth is a 20-acre lake located within the City of Salem's Cascades Gateway Park with good access all the way around. *Last updated 2/5/2025.*

WILLAMETTE RIVER: sturgeon, steelhead, spring Chinook, coho, small and largemouth bass

North Willamette – From the mouth upstream to Keizer Rapids Park

Anglers can monitor the [Willamette Falls fish counts](#) at the link below for a more up to date understanding of what salmon and steelhead are doing in the system. *Last updated 12/03/24.*

Mid-Willamette – From Keizer Rapids Park upstream to the mouth of the McKenzie River

Now that flows in the spawning tributaries are high, adult coho are much more evenly distributed throughout the basin. The better action is now primarily in the larger tributaries such as the North Santiam, Little North Santiam, and the Molalla. Other tributaries such as the Luckiamute River and Rickreall Creek are closed to salmon fishing. Anglers are allowed to keep up to two adult coho per day.

The upstream section between Albany and Harrisburg is open year-round for trout fishing, which can be very good when flows are cooperating. Look for deep slot pools and the tail-end of long riffles and the head of pools where the fish are likely stacked up in feeding lanes.

Smallmouth bass can be a lot of fun to catch and are plentiful between Salem and Corvallis during the spring and summer. Trout prefer the cooler temperatures upstream of Corvallis. From Salem downstream there are plenty of largemouth bass in the deeper, quieter sections. *Last updated 11/6/24.*

South Willamette – from the mouth of the McKenzie River upstream to the headwaters of the Willamette River.

Summer steelhead can be caught almost any month of the year. Trout fishing is open all year fishing with flies and lures – cutthroat fishing should be good when the river is not blown out. Sturgeon fishing is open – 1 per day and 2 per year (38 inch minimum, 54 inch maximum). *Last updated 11/27/24.*

OCEAN:

HALIBUT- Nearshore Season, Central Oregon, Quota = 10,000 lb Open May 1, 7 days per week, inside the 40-fathom line, until October 31 or the quota is caught, 2 fish per day, 6 fish annually.

SALMON- The 2024 ocean salmon season is closed. Update in March

BOTTOMFISH-

Port by port reports:

- Depoe Bay: Ocean conditions kept the bar restricted and anglers off the water last week.
- Newport: When conditions allowed, anglers landed about 3 fish with a mix of black, deacon, copper and yellowtail rockfishes. Lingcod landings were quite low compared to previous weeks.
- Charleston: Ocean conditions kept anglers in port last week.
- Brookings: Ocean conditions were tough last week, but fishing was decent with about 3 rockfish per angler; mostly black, blue, and deacon rockfishes brought in. No lingcod were observed.

Herring: In Oregon, **herring** come into bays and estuaries to spawn usually between Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day, though run timing has varied in recent years. We conducted our second acoustic survey on Feb. 20 and while we saw increased sign of herring in Yaquina Bay, the biomass remained low. We came across some small schools on our March 5 survey and even managed to catch a few fish after some effort. Our next survey is scheduled between March 18 and 21.

DUNGENESS CRAB- Due to inclement weather, crabbing effort in **Newport** and **Waldport** has been low. Crab catch is also low. Crab quality is good as shells have hardened and crabs are full of meat. When there has been a lot of rain, crabbing in bays is typically not good since the surge of fresh water from the rivers forces the crab to retreat to the saltier water of the ocean.

RAZOR CLAMS

- OPEN from the WA border to Cascade Head.
- CLOSED from Cascade Head to the CA border.

MUSSELS and BAY CLAMS are OPEN.

EUROPEAN GREEN CRAB This invasive species now has a limit of 35 per day to encourage harvest. While they look like Oregon's native shore crabs, they have three prominent bumps between the eyes and 5 spines down the side of the carapace.





