ODFW Fishing Report

(As of May 9th)

- Spring Chinook are starting to show up on the North Coast with a few fish being caught. Effort is starting to pick up, but thus far fishing has been slow. Tillamook Bay, the Nestucca estuary (Pacific City), Trask River, Nestucca River, and the lower Columbia tributaries (Big Cr., Gnat Cr., and Klaskanine R.) will provide the best opportunities for encountering springers this time of year.
- North Coast lakes continue to be stocked with trout (see the schedule below or online). The fish look good this year and are a great size for catching and eating! Lake Lytle is getting weedy and water quality is dropping off at Loren's Pond but the rest of the lakes are still in good shape for fishing.
- Surplus winter steelhead have been released into Coffenbury Lake, Vernonia Pond and Lost Lake, and surplus summer steelhead were released into Town Lake. Even though they've been in the lakes for a while we are getting reports of fish still being caught and many have brightened back up (mended kelts) and have some fight to them.
- The North Jetty of Tillamook Bay (accessible through Barview County Park) has been picking up for rockfish, kelp greenling, and usually starts to produce some ling cod this time of year.
- Beaches in Lincoln City, Newport, and Siuslaw as well as Tillamook and Clatsop County beaches offer great opportunities for Surf Perch. Spring and early summer are great times to surf perch fish along the midcoast and north coast. If freshwater fisheries are slow, try your line on the shore and cast for schooled up surf perch on an incoming tide.
- Steelhead fishing on the Midcoast continues to be fair in the basins that are still open, as we progress later in the

season most fisheries have slowed down, but there are still fish in the upper basins.

- Several Lakes on the midcoast have been stocked with fish this week and last week. Lake trout are a fun alternative to freshwater angling for Steelhead this time of year when conditions can be less predictable on the rivers.
- Beaches in Lincoln City, Newport, and Siuslaw offer great opportunities for Surf Perch. Spring and early summer are great times to surf perch fish along the midcoast. If freshwater fisheries are slow, try your line on the shore and cast for schooled up surf perch on an incoming tide. This weekend looks good!
- With spring on the way, the Willamette River and other waterbodies are increasing in activity.
- Several waterbodies will be stocked with trout this week.
 - Anglers report excellent spring kokanee fishing at Lake Billy Chinook, Odell Lake, and Wickiup Reservoir. Fish at Lake Billy Chinook and Odell Lake are averaging 13 inches; while 14–17-inch fish can be found at Wickiup.
 - Anglers reported fair trout fishing at Wickiup and Crane Prairie reservoirs on the April 22 season opener and should improve over the next few weeks as water temperatures rise.
 - Crooked River flows below Bowman Dam have finally decreased to a level where the Crooked should be fishable again.
 - Anglers report consistent nymphing opportunities on the Fall River.
 - Salmonfly season is just around the corner on the lower Deschutes
 - No reports of springers caught yet on the Hood River
 - The Prineville Youth Fishing Pond and Pine Nursery Pond in Bend were recently stocked and offer easily accessible fishing.

Columbia River salmon managers held a teleconference on May 7th, "to consider the following fishery: Mainstem recreational spring Chinook downstream of Bonneville Dam"- approved to remain open through May 22d.

ALSEA RIVER: Steelhead

Steelhead fishing continues to be fair on the Alsea River. A few folks are catching fish either floating lower down in the system or fishing near the hatchery holes. This weekend the water will be low and cold, offering some decent conditions for fishing any later returns.

There's a lot of bank fishing access, and fish have been getting caught, near the hatchery holes. Drift fishing in the lower basin has also been productive for anglers in the Alsea Basin. *Last updated 04/16/25.*

NESTUCCA BASIN (Nestucca, Three Rivers, and Little Nestucca): salmon, steelhead

The Nestucca gets a run of hatchery spring Chinook and those fish are starting to show up down in the estuary near Pacific City, and in the lower river from Farmer Creek Wayside down to Cloverdale. It's early in the season but we are starting to hear of some fish getting caught. There is also a run of hatchery summer steelhead in the Nestucca and the first one of the season arrived at the Cedar Creek hatchery trap today! Best fishing will be in the lower river from Cloverdale to Three Rivers during the early season. *Last updated 5/6/25.* The upper Nestucca above Moon Creek closed to angling April 1 to protect spawning wild steelhead and out-migrating juveniles and will reopen for trout and summer steelhead on May 22. *Last updated 4/3/25.*

SILETZ RIVER: winter steelhead

Winter steelhead fishing continues to slow down on the Siletz. Like its neighbors, it's been a fair season on the Siletz, with fish seemingly caught in big waves this year. Fish are taking advantage of the warmer weather and moving higher up into the basin. Fish have been caught in the upper gorge area and throughout some of the higher drift floats as we progress later into the season. The upper gorge offers bank access for targeting winter steelhead. With clear conditions going into the weekend, fish are around but seem to be more focused on spawning than biting in the upper reaches. We are seeing a few more early summer steelhead being caught in the past 2 weeks or so. As we move into spring more opportunity will be available on the Siletz! We also have our first reports of Springers being caught in the Siletz. They haven't come in full swing, but they are certainly moving into the system. Most folks fish the lower Siletz for Springers with moderate success. The Siletz is a truly unique system offering multiple opportunities for a variety of species. *Last updated 04/16/25.*

WILSON RIVER: steelhead

The Wilson gets a run of hatchery summer steelhead and those fish should be starting to show up soon. That said, it doesn't sound like there has been much effort or many summers getting caught

yet. There are no spring Chinook releases on the Wilson. Last updated 4/29/25. Wilson River levels and predictions are available [here](#).

DETROIT RESERVOIR: trout

The reservoir is slowly filling up in preparation for the busy summer recreation season. Mongold and several other boat ramps are open and available to launch watercraft. Now that spring has arrived fish are becoming more active in searching for food. Pretty much any technique will catch fish, but it might take some experimenting to find out what is most effective on the day you're out there. The reservoir gets stocked with trout during the late spring and summer with many of these fish still available throughout the fall and winter and into next year. As a reminder, anglers are allowed to keep up to five trout, with an additional five fish kokanee bag limit. Anglers are reporting good success lately. Also, as a reminder to anglers, fishing for and harvesting Chinook in the lake and the rivers above is prohibited. Any Chinook caught in Detroit must be released unharmed. Make sure you can tell the difference between a Chinook and a kokanee before you get out on the water. It's always a good idea to check the water levels at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website before using the boat ramps. For the latest information on water levels at Detroit Reservoir check with the Army Corps of Engineers' [website for more information](#). Anglers are encouraged to report their catch on an [on-line form](#). Remember to indicate whether the fish you catch have their adipose fin or not. This information will allow ODFW to manage the fishery for the benefit of both recreational anglers and the resource. *Last updated 3/31/25.*

SANTIAM RIVER (NORTH FORK): Salmon, steelhead

River levels best for fishing are at or below 3,000 cfs, and the river is currently running around 1,800 cfs at the gage in Mahama. Both the summer steelhead and spring chinook runs are beginning to develop, but it is still very early in the process. Just under 1,500 summer steelhead have passed above Willamette Falls as of May 1. The chinook run is also in its early stages, but we are already seeing hundreds cross into the upper Willamette every day. Counts at the falls are about 4,800 so far. These fish will begin to arrive in the North Santiam basin in good numbers starting in May. *Last updated 4/10/25.* There are several large, downed trees in the river creating some dangerous hazards for boaters in the lower river. For more information check out the Oregon State Marine Board website.

SANTIAM RIVER (SOUTH FORK): steelhead, bass, trout,

Fishing is generally best when flows are below 3,000 cfs. Flows are currently around 1,600 cfs at the gage in Waterloo. Counts of newly arrived summer steelhead and spring chinook have started to take off at Willamette Falls, but they will not show up in good numbers in the South Santiam until May. As a reminder, bait is not allowed from Nov. 1 to April 21. *Last updated 4/28/25.*

WALLING POND: trout, panfish

This eight-acre privately-owned pond has been **closed** since 11/8/23. No stocking scheduled due to potential changes in public access.

WALTER WIRTH LAKE: trout, bass, panfish.

This urban lake usually gets stocked from about Thanksgiving through May. The rest of the year anglers can target bluegill and bass. It will be stocked this week with 2,200 trout. Only one fish out a 5-fish bag limit may be longer than 20 inches.

Walter Wirth is a 20-acre lake located within the City of Salem's Cascades Gateway Park with good access all the way around. *Last updated 4/24/25.*

WILLAMETTE RIVER: sturgeon, steelhead, spring Chinook, coho, small and largemouth bass

Poor river conditions last week and not much effort.

Preliminary estimates for the week of April 28th – May 4th:

- Boats: 5,303 anglers – Chinook 520 kept, 47 released - Steelhead 1 kept, 6 released
- Bank: 222 anglers – Chinook 0 kept, 0 released - Steelhead 0 kept , 0 released

Fish counts:

- [Willamette Falls Counts as of 5/12/25](#): Chinook-7995, winter steelhead-4536, summer steelhead-1761

Smallmouth bass can be a lot of fun to catch and are plentiful between Salem and Corvallis during the spring and summer. Trout prefer the cooler temperatures upstream of Corvallis. From Salem downstream there are plenty of largemouth bass in the deeper, quieter sections. *Last updated 4/3/25.*

OCEAN:

HALIBUT- Nearshore Season, Central Oregon, Quota = 10,000 lb Open May 1, 7 days per week, inside the 40-fathom line, until October 31 or the quota is caught, 2 fish per day, 6 fish annually.

Garibaldi: A few boats went out for Pacific halibut, but no fish were observed in port.

Depoe Bay: Fishing was good with an average catch just over 1.5 fish per angler.

Newport: Fishing was good last week with just over 1 fish per angler.

Charleston: Anglers had good success with just over 1 fish per angler.

Brookings: Only a small number of boats went out and no fish were observed dockside.

SALMON- The planned ocean Chinook salmon season (all-salmon-except coho) **opened** as scheduled from **Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. from March 15 through May 15**. The bag limit will be two salmon, except closed to retention of coho, with minimum size limits of 24" for Chinook and 20" for steelhead. All Salmon Except Coho Season—Cape Falcon to Humbug Mountain: March 15 - June 6. Open seven days per week. Open for all salmon except coho, two salmon per day. Mark-Selective Coho (fin-clipped) Season - Cape Falcon to OR/CA border: June 7 through the earlier of August 24 or 44,000 fin-clipped coho quota. Two salmon per day. When Chinook retention is allowed, no more than one Chinook. All retained coho must have a healed adipose fin-clip.

BOTTOMFISH-

Port by port reports:

Garibaldi: Decent effort landed anglers about 2 rockfish on average, with a mix of black, canary and deacon rockfishes. Lingcod fishing was decent, with about 1 fish per angler.

Depoe Bay: Anglers saw good landings of 3 rockfish per angler, mostly black, deacon, and canary rockfishes. Lingcod landings were around 1 fish per angler.

Newport: Anglers landed close to 3 rockfish each, mainly black rockfish. Lingcod landings were about 0.75 fish per angler.

Charleston: A few anglers made it out and landed close to 3 rockfish, with mostly black and yellowtail rockfishes. Lingcod was slower at about 0.5 fish per angler.

Brookings: Landings were a little slower than the rest of the coast with about 2 rockfish each. Mostly black and blue rockfishes were brought in. Lingcod landings were slow with about 0.5 fish per angler.

DUNGENESS CRAB- OPEN- Crabbing effort in **Newport** and **Walport** has been low. Crab catch is also low. Crab quality is good as shells have hardened and crabs are full of meat. When there has been a lot of rain, crabbing in bays is typically not good since the surge of fresh water from the rivers forces the crab to retreat to the saltier water of the ocean.

RAZOR CLAMS

- OPEN from the WA border to Cascade Head.

- CLOSED from Cascade Head to the CA border.

MUSSELS and BAY CLAMS are OPEN.

EUROPEAN GREEN CRAB- OPEN- This invasive species now has a limit of 35 per day to encourage harvest. While they look like Oregon's native shore crabs, they have three prominent bumps between the eyes and 5 spines down the side of the carapace.





