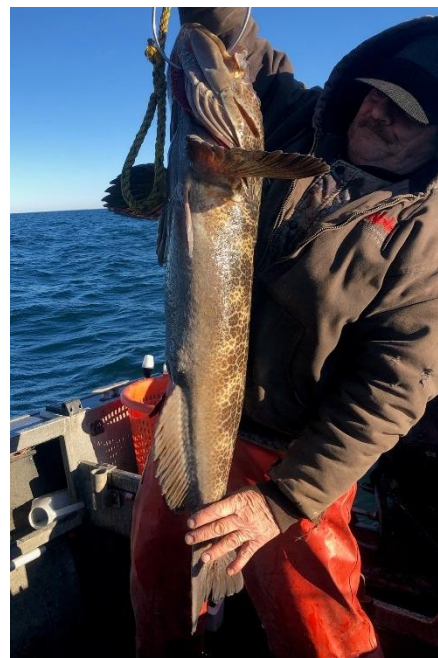
ODFW Fishing Report

(As of Apr 3d)



- Columbia- Spring Chinook closed.
- North coast steelhead fishing slowed this week and while rivers are in good shape currently; dry weather this week will have them low and clear by the weekend. The Nestucca, Wilson and North Fork Nehalem rivers will offer the best opportunities for catching hatchery steelhead. Many tributaries and upper river sections close to steelhead angling March 31, so be sure to check the regulations before heading out in April.
- North Coast lakes have been stocked with trout and those listed below will be getting a second stocking this week. The fish look really good this year and are a great size for catching and eating! One exception is South lake, which was not able to be stocked due to snow on the access road; we will be getting those fish in as soon as possible.
- Surplus winter steelhead have been released into Coffenbury Lake, Vernonia Pond and Lost Lake, and surplus summer steelhead were released into Town Lake recently. These fish can be a great alternative when conditions in the rivers are less than ideal and fighting a steelhead in still water is a unique and fun experience.
- Beaches in Lincoln City, Newport, and Siuslaw offer great opportunities for Surf Perch. Spring and early summer are great times to surf perch fish along the midcoast. If freshwater fisheries are slow, try your line on the shore and cast for schooled up surf perch on an incoming tide. This weekend looks good!
- Rains came late last week and into the weekend rising most of our Mid Coast rivers. The weekend may be fishable depending on how the rest of the week's
- With spring on the way, the Willamette River and other waterbodies are increasing in activity.
- Kokanee fishing continues to be excellent on Lake Billy Chinook with fish averaging 13 inches; however, with spring run-off occurring water clarity is reduced in the Crooked and Deschutes River Arms making for challenging conditions
- With most year-round stream fisheries affected by spring runoff and poor water clarity, the spring-fed Metolius River is a good bet for consistent fishing for redband trout and whitefish.
- Anglers report good fishing for brown trout on the upper Deschutes upstream of the Old Mill area in Bend and around Tumalo State Park.
- At Haystack Reservoir anglers report good fishing for both trophy-size excess brood hatchery trout and holdover trout in the 16 to 17-inch range.

ALSEA RIVER: Steelhead

Steelhead fishing continues to be fair on the Alsea River. A few folks are catching fish either floating lower down in the system or fishing near the hatchery holes. The bite has definitely slowed down but fish are still in the system as we head into another fishable weekend.

There's a lot of bank fishing access, and fish have been getting caught, near the hatchery holes. Drift fishing in the lower basin has also been productive for anglers in the Alsea Basin. Last updated 04/03/25.

NESTUCCA BASIN (Nestucca, Three Rivers, and Little Nestucca): winter steelhead

The Nestucca is in good shape, and while it will get a little low this week, it should remain fishable.

There are hatchery and wild (catch and release only for wilds) throughout the fishery. The Nestucca has been fair for winter steelhead, but it looks like it will be a little high this weekend and early next week. When it's in shape there should be fish throughout the fishery. The upper Nestucca above Moon Creek closed to angling April 1 to protect spawning wild steelhead and out-migrating juveniles and will reopen for trout and summer steelhead on May 22. *Last updated 4/3/25.*

SILETZ RIVER: winter steelhead

Winter steelhead slowed down a bit on the Siletz. Like its neighbors, it's been a fair season on the Siletz, with fish seemingly being caught in big waves this year. Fish are taking advantage of the warmer weather and moving higher up into the basin. Fish have been caught in the upper gorge area and throughout some of the lower drift floats. The upper gorge offers bank access for targeting winter steelhead. The gorge road has been cleared out and is accessible throughout the entire upper fishery. We have had quite a bit of rain the past week and fish are likely pushing up further into the gorge and higher into the system. We did have a few reports of early summer steelhead being caught as well the past week or so, as we move into spring more opportunity is available on the Siletz! Just a reminder that the gorge road is closed to public driving access during the weekdays M-F but opens for the weekend. The Siletz is a truly unique system offering multiple opportunities for a variety of species. Last updated 04/03/25.

WILSON RIVER: winter steelhead

Winter steelhead fishing on the Wilson has been fair to good since it dropped back into shape early this week. It is predicted to go up a little again on Friday but should be fishable through the weekend. The Wilson is one of our largest broodstock hatchery releases and there should be fish throughout the fishery and fresh steelhead still coming in. There are both hatchery and wild steelhead (catch-and-release only for wilds) throughout the fishery. *Last updated 3/19/25.* Wilson River levels and predictions are available [here](#).

DETROIT RESERVOIR: trout

The reservoir is slowly filling up in preparation for the busy summer recreation season. Mongold boat ramp is currently open and available to launch watercraft. Now that spring is around the corner fish are starting to get hungrier and become more active in searching for food. Pretty much any technique will catch fish, but it might take some experimenting to find out what is most effective on the day you're out there. The reservoir gets stocked with trout during the spring and summer with many of these fish still available throughout the fall and winter and into next year. As a reminder, anglers are allowed to keep up to five trout, with an additional five fish kokanee bag limit. Also, as a reminder to anglers, fishing for and harvesting Chinook in the lake and the rivers above is prohibited. Any Chinook caught in Detroit must be released unharmed. Make sure you can tell the difference between a Chinook and a kokanee before you get out on the water.

It's always a good idea to check the water levels at the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers website before using the boat ramps. For the latest information on water levels at Detroit Reservoir check with the Army Corps of Engineers' [website for more information](#). Anglers are encouraged to report their catch on an [on-line form](#). Remember to indicate whether the fish you catch have their adipose fin or not. This information will allow ODFW to manage the fishery for the benefit of both recreational anglers and the resource. *Last updated 3/31/25.*

SANTIAM RIVER (NORTH FORK): Salmon, steelhead

River levels best for fishing are at or below 3,000 cfs, and the river is currently running around 7,000 cfs at the gage in Mehama. Just over 240 summer steelhead have passed above Willamette Falls but the run has started to pick up in the past week. Fishing for steelhead is open year-round, but the use of bait is not allowed between Nov. 1 and April 21. *Last updated 3/31/25.*

There are several large, downed trees in the river creating some dangerous hazards for boaters in the lower river. For more information check out the Oregon State Marine Board website.

SANTIAM RIVER (SOUTH FORK): steelhead, bass, trout,

Fishing is generally best when flows are below 3,000 cfs. Flows are currently around 6,400 cfs at the gage in Waterloo. Just over 240 summer steelhead have passed above Willamette Falls so far, but the run has started to pick up in the past week. Bait is not allowed from Nov. 1 to April 21. *Last updated 3/31/25.*

WALLING POND: trout, panfish

This eight-acre privately-owned pond has been **closed** since 11/8/23. No stocking scheduled due to potential changes in public access.

WALTER WIRTH LAKE: trout, bass, panfish.

This urban lake usually gets stocked from about Thanksgiving through May. The rest of the year anglers can target bluegill and bass. It will be stocked this week with 2,200 trout. Only one fish out a 5-fish bag limit may be longer than 20 inches.

Walter Wirth is a 20-acre lake located within the City of Salem's Cascades Gateway Park with good access all the way around. *Last updated 3/31/25.*

WILLAMETTE RIVER: sturgeon, steelhead, spring Chinook, coho, small and largemouth bass

Poor river conditions last week and not much effort.

Preliminary estimates for Week of March 24-30.

- **Boats:** 535 anglers - Chinook 22 kept, 7 released - Steelhead 4 kept, 0 released
- **Bank:** 292 anglers - Chinook 0 kept 2 released - Steelhead 4 kept, 8 released

Fish counts:

- [Willamette Falls Counts as of 3/30/25](#): Chinook-0, winter steelhead-3,564, summer steelhead-242

The upstream section between Albany and Harrisburg is open year-round for trout fishing, which can be very good when flows are cooperating. Look for deep slot pools and the tail-end of long riffles and the head of pools where the fish are likely stacked up in feeding lanes.

Smallmouth bass can be a lot of fun to catch and are plentiful between Salem and Corvallis during the spring and summer. Trout prefer the cooler temperatures upstream of Corvallis. From Salem downstream there are plenty of largemouth bass in the deeper, quieter sections. *Last updated 4/3/25.*

South Willamette – from the mouth of the McKenzie River upstream to the headwaters of the Willamette River.

Summer steelhead can be caught almost any month of the year. Trout fishing is open all year fishing with flies and lures – cutthroat fishing should be good when the river is not blown out. Sturgeon fishing is open – 1 per day and 2 per year (38 inch minimum, 54 inch maximum). *Last updated 11/27/24.*

OCEAN:

HALIBUT- Nearshore Season, Central Oregon, Quota = 10,000 lb Open May 1, 7 days per week, inside the 40-fathom line, until October 31 or the quota is caught, 2 fish per day, 6 fish annually.

SALMON- The planned ocean Chinook salmon season (all-salmon-except coho) **opened** as scheduled from **Cape Falcon to Humbug Mt. from March 15 through May 15**. The bag limit will be two salmon, except closed to retention of coho, with minimum size limits of 24" for Chinook and 20" for steelhead.

BOTTOMFISH-

Port by port reports:

- Depoe Bay: Ocean conditions improved for a few days and anglers saw about 2.5 fish per angler, mostly black, deacon, canary and yellowtail rockfishes. Lingcod landings improved to just over 1 fish per angler.
- Newport: Last week brought a few good fishing days and the bite was decent. Anglers landed close to 2 fish each with mostly black and deacon rockfishes. Lingcod landings were quite low with about 1 fish for every 4 anglers.
- Charleston: Only a few boats made it out last week, with an average of 3 rockfish per angler. Lingcod was decent at about 1 fish per angler.
- Brookings: A few boats got out and fishing was decent with about 2.5 rockfish per angler. Mostly black, blue, and deacon rockfishes were brought in. Lingcod landings were quite low.

HERRING: In Oregon, herring come into bays and estuaries to spawn usually between Valentine's Day and St. Patrick's Day, though run timing has varied in recent years. We conducted our second acoustic survey on Feb. 20 and while we saw increased sign of herring in Yaquina Bay, the biomass remained low. We came across some small schools on our March 5 survey and even managed to catch a few fish after some effort. In 2025, herring spawned on March 13 at limited areas around Yaquina Bay. While there were still some anglers catching herring last week, our sixth acoustic survey on March 24 showed a substantial decline in biomass from our prior week's survey. Another spawning event reportedly occurred on March 26 and it appears that fishing has slowed down since

then. Since most fish depart the bay within days of spawning, this likely signals the end of the 2025 spawning run.

DUNGENESS CRAB- OPEN- Due to inclement weather, crabbing effort in **Newport** and **Waldport** has been low. Crab catch is also low. Crab quality is good as shells have hardened and crabs are full of meat. When there has been a lot of rain, crabbing in bays is typically not good since the surge of fresh water from the rivers forces the crab to retreat to the saltier water of the ocean.

RAZOR CLAMS

- OPEN from the WA border to Cascade Head.
- CLOSED from Cascade Head to the CA border.

MUSSELS and BAY CLAMS are OPEN.

EUROPEAN GREEN CRAB- OPEN- This invasive species now has a limit of 35 per day to encourage harvest. While they look like Oregon's native shore crabs, they have three prominent bumps between the eyes and 5 spines down the side of the carapace.

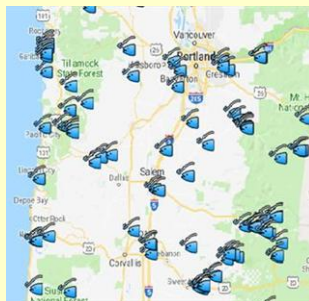

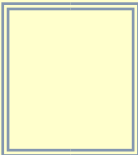
